Preliminary competitions open at any established Agricultural Fair in New Hampshire which desires to include this competition in its Premium List. The New Hampshire Maple Producers' Association will award suitable ribbons to the New Hampshire winners of first, second and third places at each fair as determined by the usual judging practice. New Hampshire winners of first, second and third places in the "open class" for maple syrup at any established Agricultural Fair in New Hampshire will be eligible to compete for the Carlisle Trophy. Final competition for the Carlisle Trophy will take place at the annual meeting of the N.H. Maple Producers' Association and the trophy will be presented at that time. Contestants in the final competition must enter a one-quart sample of syrup. Entries must be delivered to the Secretary of the said Association before 10:00 a.m. on the day of the annual meeting. The selection of judges and other details will be the responsibility of the Publicity Committee. 1. Maple syrup destined for the Carlisle competition, must be designated as a Carlisle entry when entered into a New Hampshire fair. All entries must be produced in New Hampshire, and be entered by the person who produced it. 2. Each entrant must be a paid member of the New Hampshire Maple Producers Association before submitting syrup designated as a Carlisle entry at any fair. There will be no exceptions. 3. The same lot of syrup which won first . Second or third place at a New Hampshire fair should be the one entered into the Carlisle competition. 4. Only one entry per sugar house will be allowed into the Carlisle competition of the New Hampshire Maple Producers Association. 5. Only standard canning jars (pints or quarts) with 2-piece metal lids will be judged. All pickles must be sealed. One entry per class. Collections must be displayed in a basket or gift box. All jars must be labeled.

2. After articles are entered, they will be under the exclusive charge of the committee until the exhibition is closed.

3. No fruits, vegetables, or grains will be entitled to a prize or gratuity unless they possess points of superiority and are properly identified.

4. No award will be made to unworthy objects even though they be the only ones on exhibition.

5. All fruits and vegetables offered for premiums must be correctly named. Only one entry is allowed per person in each class.

6. No person can compete for more than one prize with the same variety or varieties.

7. Specimens or vegetables must be well grown.

8. Exhibits must be placed by 1:00 PM Tuesday.
